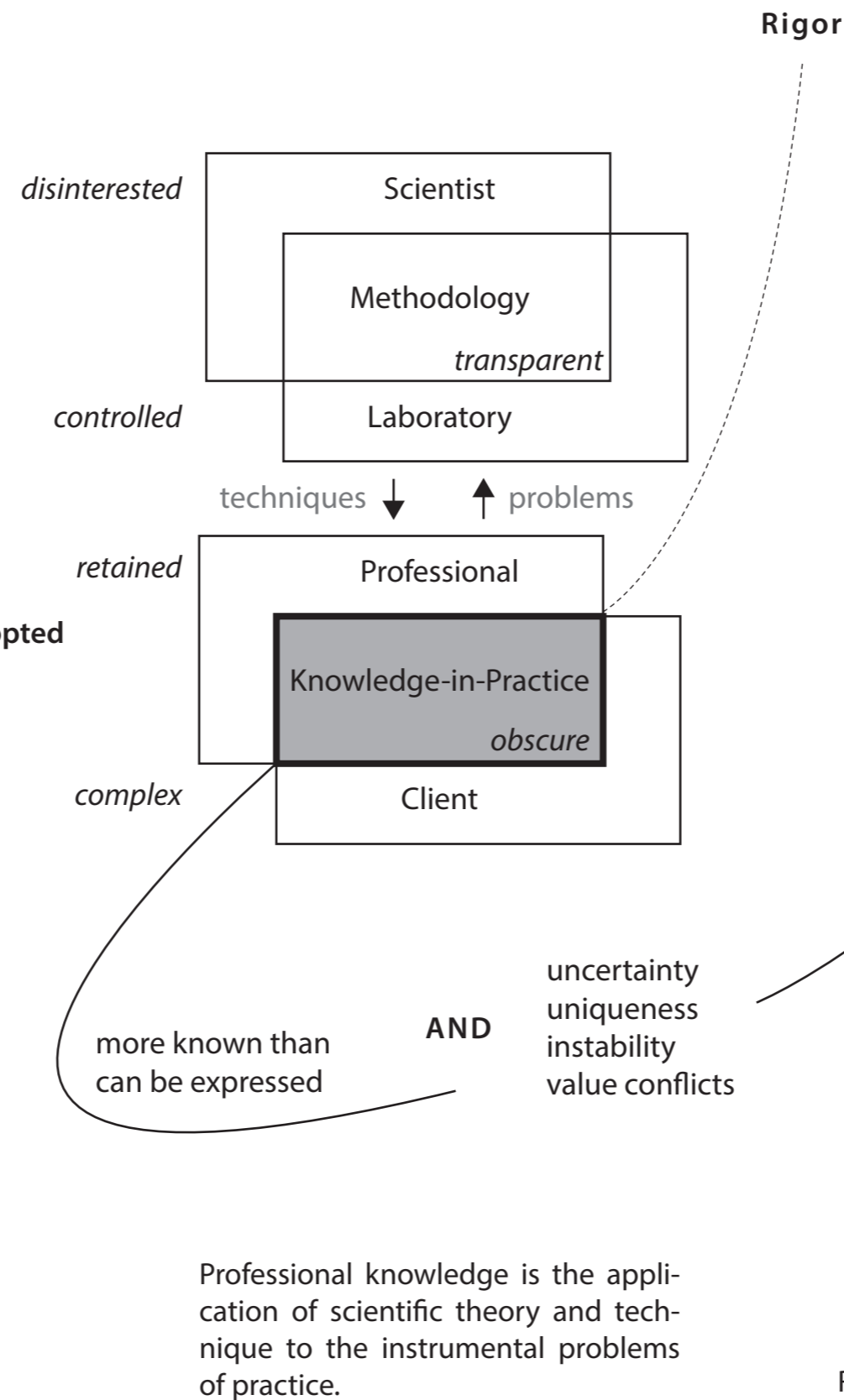


Radical Critique



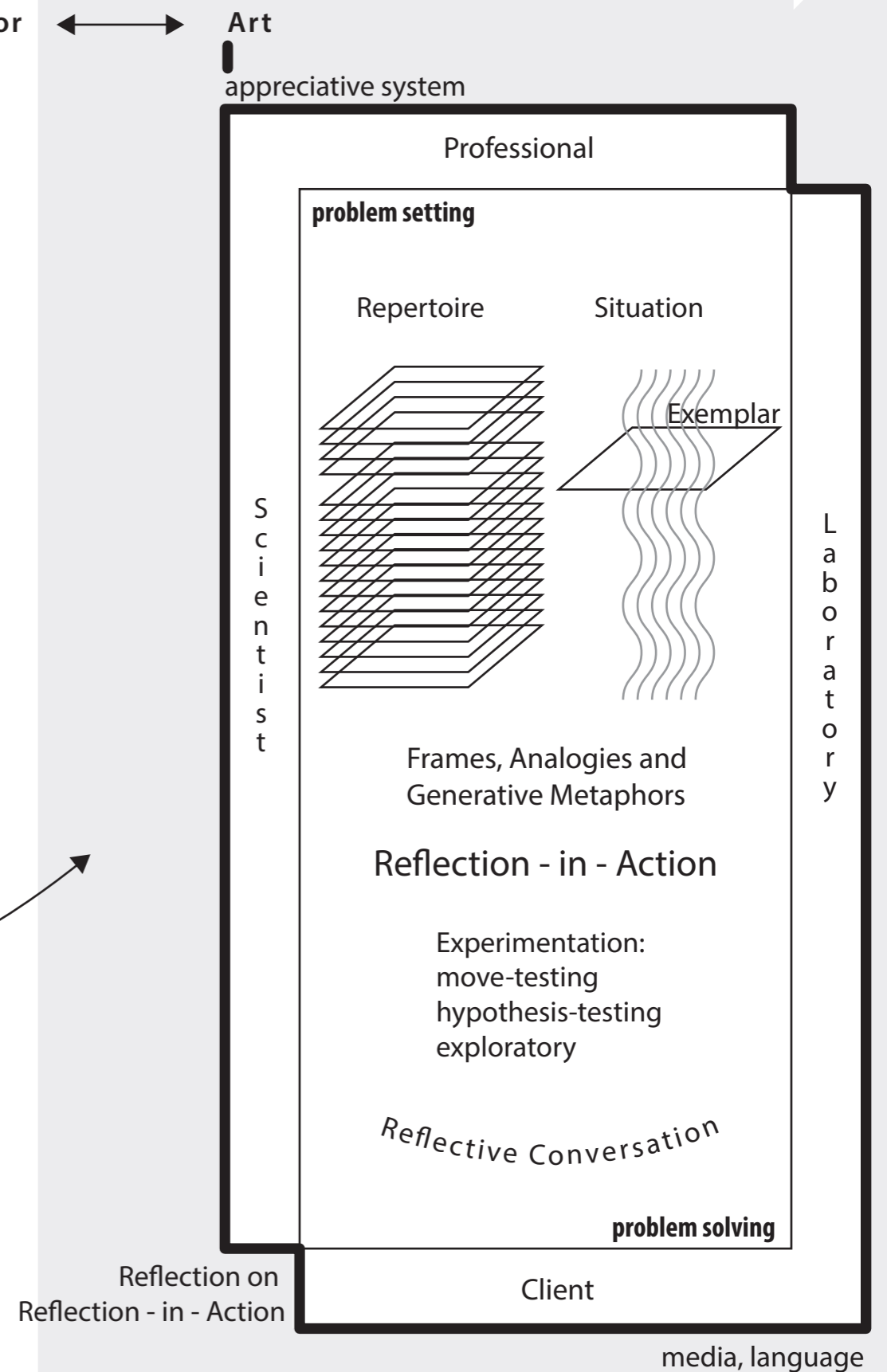

Positivist Epistemology of Practice: Technical Rationality



Professional knowledge is the application of scientific theory and technique to the instrumental problems of practice.

Across processes of inquiry, differences in evaluation may not be objectively resolvable. Resolution of such differences depends on the little-understood ability of inquirers to enter into one another's appreciative systems and to make reciprocal translations from one to the other.
